





Digital public goods and digital public infrastructure

- Digital public goods empower societies and individuals to direct digital technologies to their development needs and can facilitate digital cooperation and investment.
- Resilient, safe, inclusive and interoperable digital public infrastructure has the potential to deliver services at scale ... There are multiple models of digital public infrastructure, and that each society will develop and use shared digital systems according to its specific priorities and needs.
- We consider such digital public goods and digital public infrastructure to be key drivers of inclusive digital transformation and innovation.







#### Final reflections
