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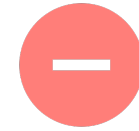

- Essential for SDG4



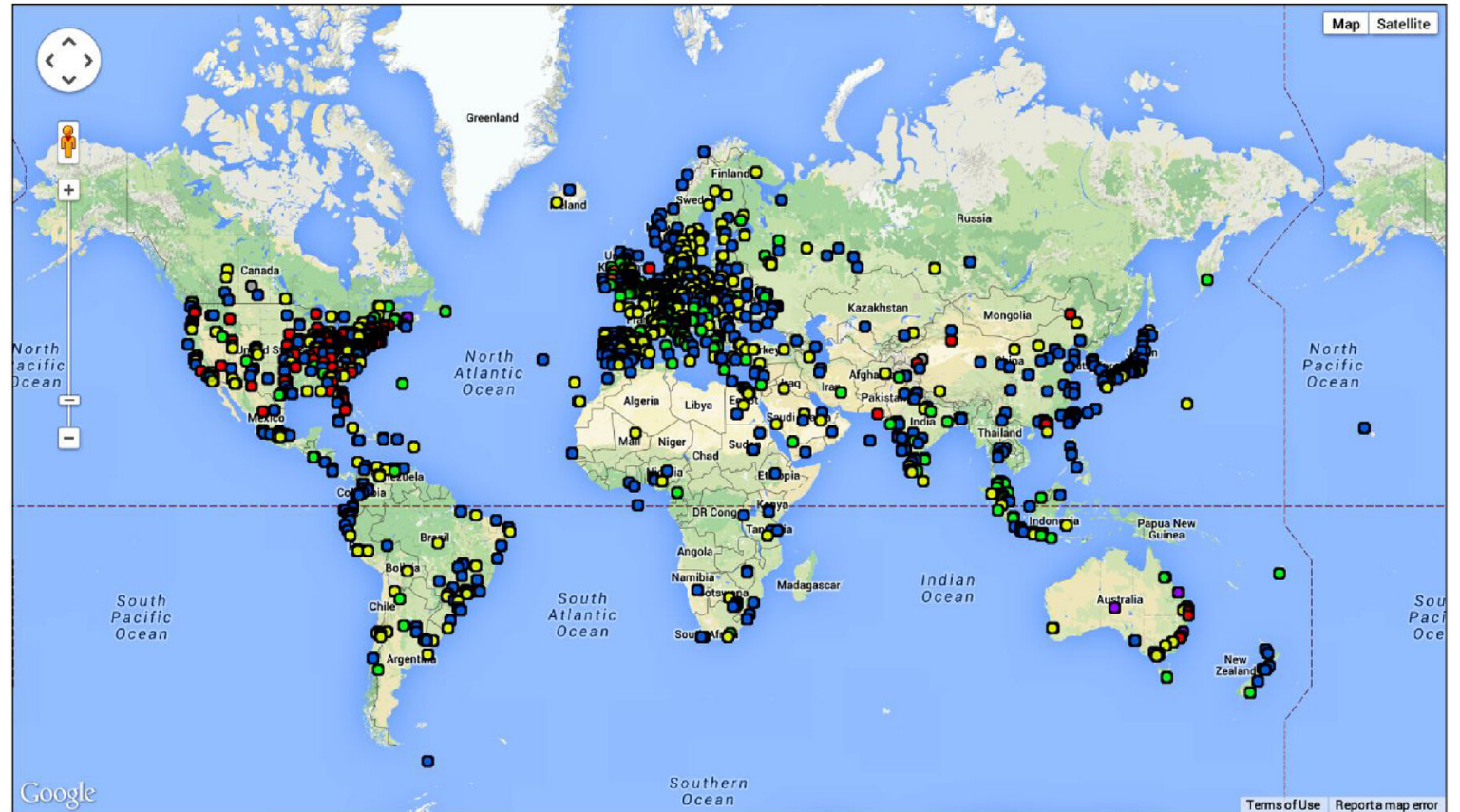
- Poor discoverability
- Disconnected
- Fragmented
- Poor interoperability
- No quality assurance
- Suboptimal infrastructure
- Limited availability to potential users

Build on existing infrastructures, standards, networks

- c.5,000 institutional repositories worldwide (2021)
- Metadata, persistent identifiers and licences provided.
- Metadata harvested & aggregated by services such as OpenAIRE.
- Powerful open, non commercial infrastructure
- Equitable & sustainable
- Libraries of all kinds are involved
- Technical developments, e.g., NOTIFY from COAR



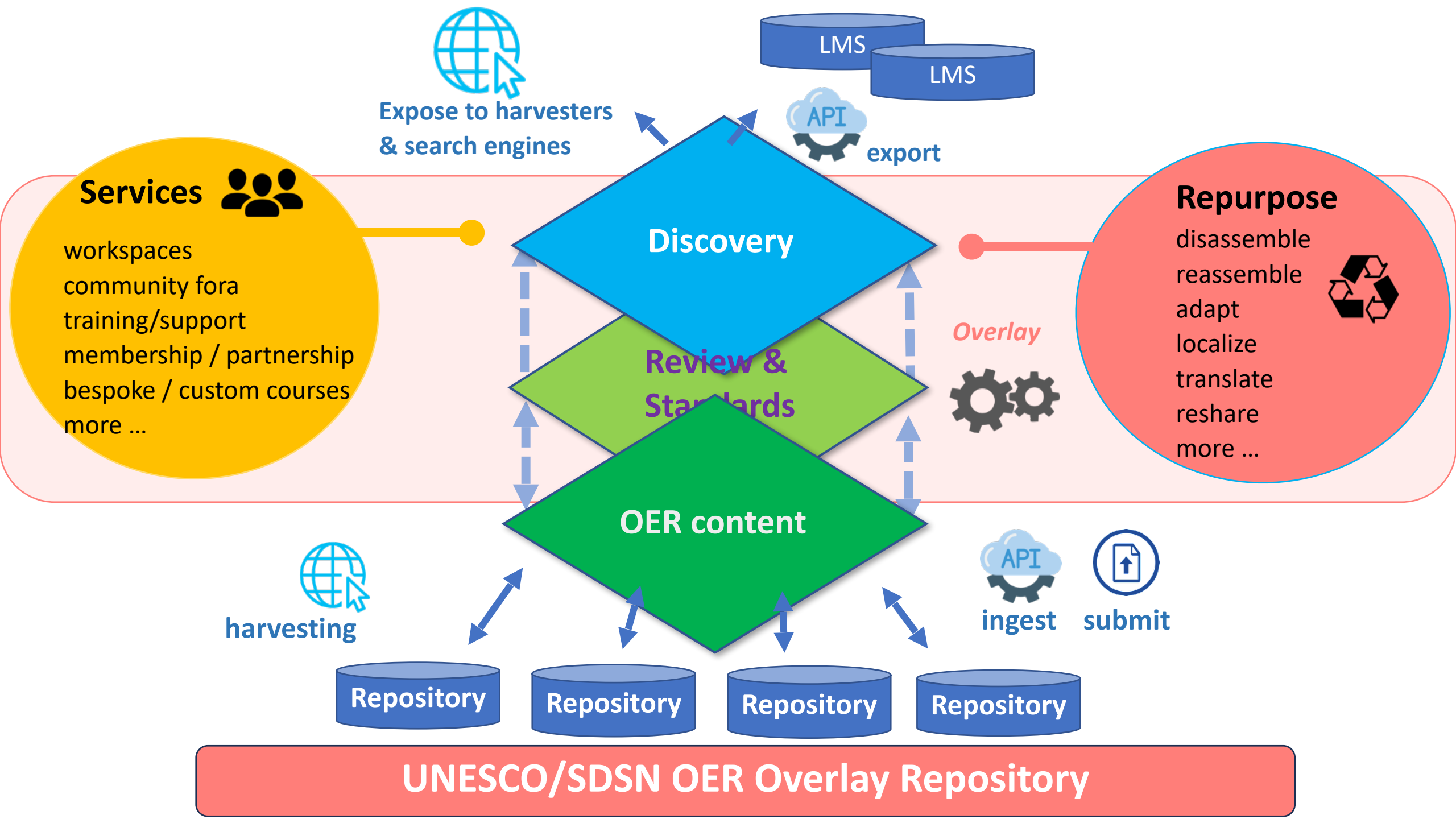
Map of institutional repositories worldwide, 2021*

FAIR, CARE, FOREST, POSI, AmeliCA, etc. principles are the central facet and the foundation of the Global Knowledge Commons.



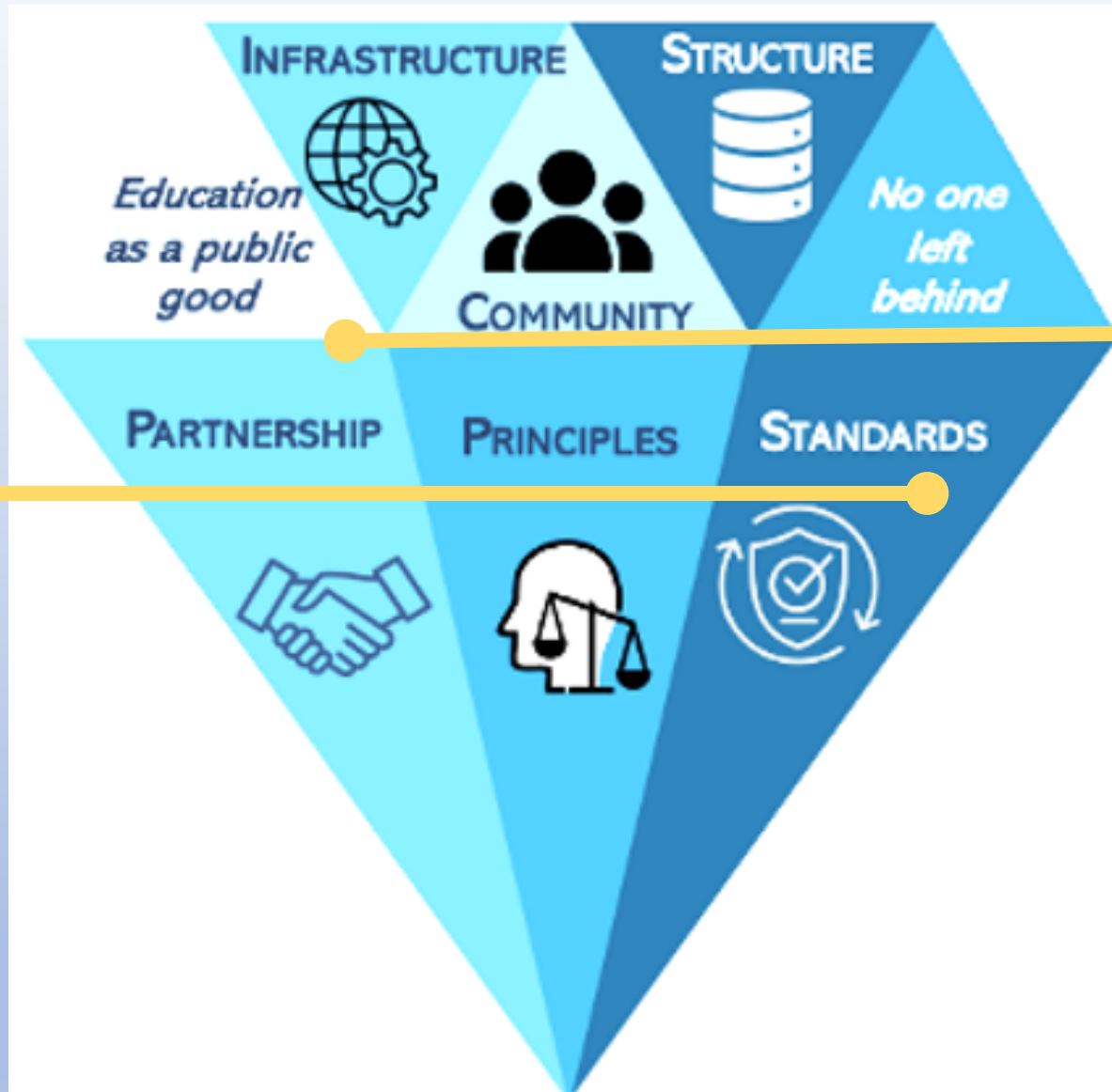
Standards

Standards and Interoperability underpin the infrastructure and enable knowledge sharing across systems.



Community

The global community is the audience and also represents citizens, academics and researchers, lifelong learners, Citizen Scientists, content co-creators.



Partnership



Policy-makers, research performing institutions, libraries and digital, policy, legal and advocacy networks.

Structure



Enabling structure based on educators, content creators, researchers, librarians

Infrastructure



Open, non-profit, publicly-owned distributed infrastructure
